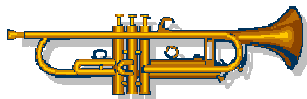

ROYAL WEDDING – STREET PARTIES

Are you planning a street party for the Royal Wedding? If you need a road closure it is simple to apply, all you need to do is send me an email with the details. Please see article <http://www.miltonkeynes.gov.uk/highways/DisplayArticle.> 58
10 on the Milton Keynes Council website.

There is no charge for the legal work, publishing in the paper and site notices for these parties.

All you need to tell me is which road you are closing and the duration of your party. You also need to confirm that you have contacted all the residents that will be affected by the road closure and that you have their agreement to go ahead.

We are asking for the road signage to be on correct road signs in order to keep the parties safe and keep drivers away from where the events are taking place. You can either apply to Mark Bowater, at the Bleak Hall Depot, who is supplying the signs on a loan basis at £10 plus a deposit. If the party is in a Cul-de-Sac then of course only one road closed sign will be required, if it is on a through route then more will be required for the alternative route. You may too have a friendly contractor who can help you out instead.

ASTRA
All Saints Tower Restoration Appeal



During the 'clean up' campaign inside the tower a 'graffiti wall' has been discovered. From 1902 visitors have put their signatures in the Second Level Observer Room to celebrate their ascent of the tower.

We believe the room to have been built by the 'Observer Corps' in the lead up to World War I. In World War II, we understand, a small group were garrisoned there, charged with 'spotting enemy activity'. There is little doubt that from this post the Bombing Coventry was witnessed; it was widely reported by villagers that the horizon to the north glowed red, such was the devastation. Did a relative of yours witness this? Did a relative of yours act as an observer during these dark years in our history?

If a member of your family has signed this wall (and hundreds have) we would like to offer you the opportunity to join them in becoming a permanent part of the history of the church by adding your signature alongside.

If you are new to the village but want to add your name too, we will find you an appropriate area to sign!

If you would like to support ASTRA in this way and have the unique privilege of adding to your 'graffiti wall' – which, until now, has remained untouched for years – we would ask for a minimum donation of £10.00 towards the expensive renovations we are putting in hand to keep the tower standing for future generations.

Can you help spare a few hours a year and help us with our collections? We desperately need some extra pairs of willing hands !!

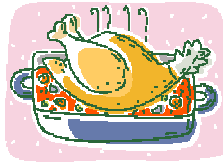

This year's benefice Maundy Thursday Last Supper will be held on

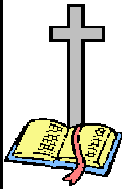
Thursday 21st April

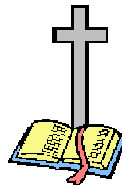
