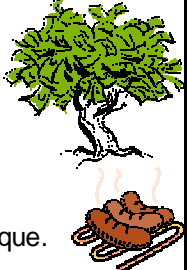

Pauline will be advising us on any hearing problems that we may have.

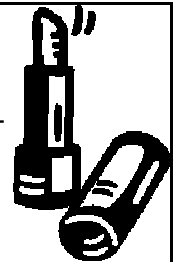

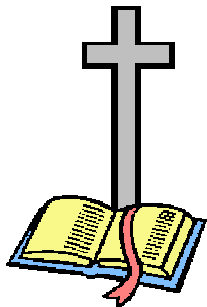

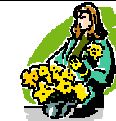
