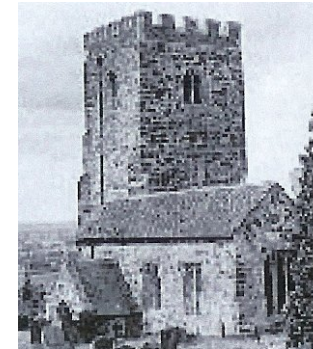

## HOW SMART IS YOUR DRIVING?

Most car drivers could be travelling a lot further on a tank of fuel. No new car is required - just a change to smarter driving. Try these tips:



- Shift up the gears earlier (between 2000 and 2500rpm). Cruising comfortably in 5th gear is the best place to be.
- Cut your top speed. Wind resistance increases significantly with speed. The optimum speed for fuel efficiency is 45 – 50mph.
- Avoid unnecessary braking by anticipating the traffic ahead. Fluid motion is better than stop start.
- When slowing down, stay in gear and take your foot off the accelerator as early as possible. This reduces fuel consumption to near zero.
- Plan your route to avoid congestion or getting lost.

Once the results have been analysed we will publish the results together with the recommendations from the council as to the best next actions.

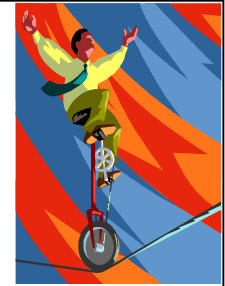

### **LETTER FROM THE RECTOR**

Keeping Hope Alive  
Christian Aid Week 10<sup>th</sup> – 16<sup>th</sup> May

Dear friends,

Christian Aid Week is a celebration of hope and life. It brings together as many as 300,000 people in this country, from churches and other community groups, to do something positive for people in poverty, by giving and collecting donations.

We hear a lot about financial problems at the moment, and some of us are in very difficult situations. However, we should not forget that we are still wealthy and privileged, compared to the majority of the world's people. For Christian people, our giving is part of our thanksgiving to God, and a sign of our trust that God provides more than enough for us to share. It is good to give what we can, whether it is a large or small amount.

Can a small amount of money make a difference? This year Christian Aid Week points to the example of their work in the Democratic Republic of Congo, and an eighteen year-old girl called Nadia. One of Christian Aid's partner organisations is giving her the opportunity to take a tailoring course, so that she can avoid being drawn into sex work or other kinds of exploitation, and instead learn positive skills that will enable her to provide herself, and help to provide for her family.

- £5 could buy 6 yards of material, to make a three-piece woman's outfit
- £10 could provide enough material for a 12 month tailoring course
- £40 could pay a month's salary for an instructor

Even small amounts that we give can be part of making a big difference.
