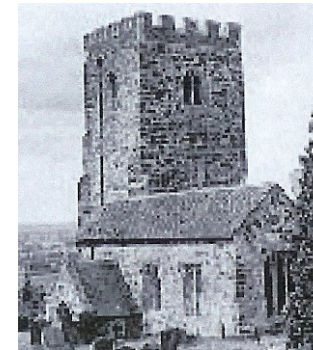

THE REAL GREEN DEAL... PLEASE STAND UP

Is grant support for home insulation soon to be replaced by loans? The government's latest proposals certainly imply this.

The Green Deal proposes to spread the cost of new home insulation across future energy bills associated with a property. It is hoped that this will remove any obvious barrier to getting the work done. A guiding principle is that insulation installed must save the householder more money than the extra charge on their bills.

However, we don't yet know how much loan interest repayments will add to the cost. Currently cavity wall and loft insulation cost under £100 each in some areas thanks to Council grants. The Energy Saving Trust estimates households can save £115 each year with cavity wall insulation. This is a remarkable return on investment.

Get insulation installed in 2011 and you'll benefit from a grant. Beyond March 2012, when energy supplier grants are up for review, this is much less certain. So, for householders with savings, no intention of moving home and no desire to pay interest on a loan, today's best offers arguably represent the *real* green deal.

Taking advantage of grant offers is easy. You can compare insulation deals at cocoonyourhome.co.uk or on 0800 8048 777, or check with the Council.

Cocoon is an independent comparison service operated by United Sustainable Energy Agency, a not-for-profit organisation.

THE BOW BRICKHILL CLUB APRIL MEETING

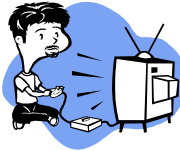

The Reader Service is a voluntary organisation helping blind and disabled people with a reading and writing service in their own home, while also being a facilitation service enabling visually impaired people to go shopping. This among other services is available free for any disabled person living in the Milton Keynes area who finds reading or writing difficult due to their disability.



This talk proved to be so popular that we have arranged for a return visit later this summer for a talk on the training of "Guide dogs for the blind". Having already had a talk on "Hearing dogs for the deaf" we know this will be a very interesting afternoon.

Our next meeting will be on **Tuesday May 3rd** when, courtesy of "Age UK Milton Keynes", we shall spend an afternoon being introduced to the fun and intricacy of "Wii". START THINKING EARLY HOW YOU WILL KEEP WARM THIS WINTER

It may seem too early to start talking about winter warmth but if you struggled to keep your home warm last year, you are likely to experience the same problems this winter too. As the price of fuel increases, energy bills can become unmanageable. To help combat this, a free phone helpline has been set up to advise residents in Milton Keynes how to cut their fuel bills.

The service is offered by the United Sustainable Energy Agency in partnership with Milton Keynes Council, Milton Keynes Age UK and Milton Keynes Primary Care Trust.

Anyone who is struggling with their fuel bills can call 0800 107 00 44 for free, impartial advice on:

- Cavity wall and loft insulation including the grants available
- Grants and loans to help with heating system replacements
- Government payments
- How to switching energy suppliers to get the best deal
- Advice on fuel debt
- How to be more energy efficient
- Other support organisations in Milton Keynes

Some of these improvements can take a few months to install; don't wait until it gets cold to phone

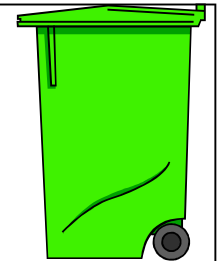
