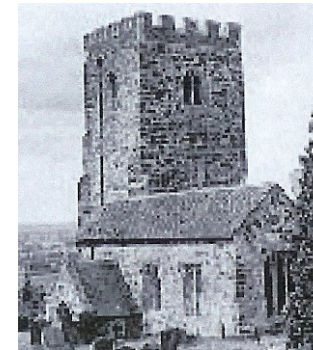

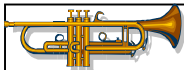

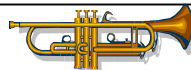

Her passion started when as an eleven year-old she began collecting old glass bottles, eventually amassing a total of 350. Anna started an art degree course but inspired by a session on stained glass she transferred to Chelsea College of Art which ran an HND course specialising in this area. She struggled a little after leaving college but a lucky break led to an order for Richard Branson and a subsequent appearance on 'Richard and Judy' and she has never looked back. Anna concluded with some wonderful slides of panels and windows which have inspired her work and also many of her own projects.

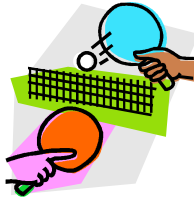

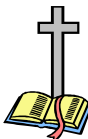
